#### **UPDATE ON TESTING REQUIREMENTS BY HOSPITAL GROUPS: 18 JUNE 2020**

It has been over four weeks since hospital groups introduced more stringent COVID-19 protocols for representative access to their hospitals. In some cases (Netcare), this includes a requirement that all representatives entering theatres present a negative test result not older than 7 days.

As previously reported, SAMED has deliberated at length on the matter and has met with Netcare in order to discuss the requirements, offer alternative solutions and commit to further engagement.

As a result, SAMED and Masoom have developed and introduced a COVID-19 specific programme into CRICE at all levels (white, blue and green). The COVID-19 animations add to the existing CRICE info that already covers PPE and Aseptic techniques. This programme has already been communicated to the industry.

In addition, SAMED has reviewed the potential risk categorisation of medical representatives and technicians depending on which hospital department they visit. There are hospital departments in which medical representatives would present far less of a risk and only the normal hospital screening should apply. Consequently, SAMED has proposed that COVID -19 testing only be required for medical representatives and technical assistants working in the presence of patients in potentially high-risk areas.



Notwithstanding the above, Netcare has distributed an updated letter on 10 June 2020 which retains the requirements for a negative COVID-19 test, not older than 7 days, to be presented on the day of access to the hospital.

As stated before, SAMED supports any screening, controlled or reduced access to hospitals and the correct utilization of PPE/hand sanitization. However, SAMED members, and the industry as a whole, continue to question the protocol for representatives to provide a negative COVID-19 test result every 7 days for a number of reasons; particularly, that the testing environment is under significant pressure and that the use of these testing resources for this purpose is not appropriate.

We have consulted widely on this matter with NICD, NIOH, RSSA, specific surgical associations as well as legal experts and despite the fact that both the NICD and Advamed (international) protocols do not include company representatives testing as a requirement, the input which we receive is consistent. The private hospitals have every right to determine the specific conditions for entry into their hospitals as they ultimately have the responsibility for the safety of their patients and staff. It is thus up to each health establishment to decide on their medical surveillance protocols that they wish to use.

Whilst this is clearly not the feedback any of our SAMED companies wish to hear, given the additional cost and logistical considerations, we currently have no choice but to comply with the hospital protocol requirements in terms of testing until further notice.

SAMED will continue to engage with Netcare as well as other hospital groups to ensure that a mutually beneficial compromise is reached as soon as possible.

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it had been just over 100 days since the first case of coronavirus was identified in South Africa and acknowledged the disruption the pandemic had brought to the lives and livelihoods of millions.

He shared the positive news of a breakthrough treatment of COVID-19 (the drug dexamethasone) which is also manufactured in South Africa and of which there is an ample supply. The drug reduced deaths among patients on ventilation by a third in an international study.

Ramaphosa highlighted how South Africa, like many other countries, has been affected by the global shortage of coronavirus test kits and other materials. He stated that SA had become more targeted with testing; prioritising patients in hospitals, health care workers, vulnerable people like the elderly and hotspot areas. He indicated that government was using every avenue available to source the supplies needed and to increase our testing capacity and improve the turnaround time within the labs.

Following further discussions with industry representatives on stringent prevention protocols, and after advice from scientists and consultation with Premiers, Cabinet decided to further ease restrictions on certain other economic activities.

These activities include:

- Restaurants for 'sit-down' meals
- Accredited and licensed accommodation, with the exception of home-sharing accommodation like Airbnb.
- Conferences and meetings for business purposes and in line with restrictions on public gatherings.
- Cinemas and theatres, to be aligned to limitations on the gathering of people.
- Casinos.
- · Personal care services, including hairdressers and beauty services
- Non-contact sports such as golf, tennis, cricket and others. Contact sports will be allowed only for training and modified activities with restricted use of facilities



In each instance, specific and stringent safety requirements have been agreed on and will need to be put in place before a business can re-open, and protocols will need to be strictly adhered to for businesses to remain open. Announcements will be made in due course to detail these measures and indicate the date from which these activities will be permitted.

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# SARS: PUBLICATION OF EXPLANATORY SUMMARY OF THE DISASTER MANAGEMENT TAX RELIEF ADMINISTRATION BILL

SARS has issued a notice that the Minister of Finance intends to introduce the Disaster Management Tax Relief Administration Bill, 2020, in the National Assembly on 24 June 2020.

The Bill provides for tax measures in order to assist with alleviating cash flow burdens on tax compliant micro and small to medium-sized businesses arising as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and measures taken under the Disaster Management Act, 2002; to provide for the employees' tax treatment of donations to the Solidarity Fund; to provide for a change in the value-added tax category of vendors to effect monthly returns and refunds and to provide for matters connected therewith.
