COVID-19 WEBINAR: LET THE CHILDREN HACE THEIR SAY

COVID-19 and the general response to it (lockdown and school disruption) has impacted on the social wellbeing and mental and physical health of everyone, especially children.

The socio-economic fall out will be felt by children as caregivers may lose income, contract the disease, possibly be quarantined or succumb to the virus. Despite this, the voices of children are hardly ever heard.

Their fears, hopes and bewilderment remain unheard and in the margins. Parents may be unwittingly failing to engage in important conversations with their children.

Health Minister Zweli Mkhize has warned that South Africa is on the verge of facing a spike in coronavirus cases and related deaths which <u>means another hard lockdown "may become necessary"</u>. Speaking to Talk Radio 702 morning host Bongani Bingwa on Tuesday, Mkhize said things were "getting tough". "I wish I could say otherwise. We have warned that the surge will come, [especially] in the winter months. I'm afraid the numbers are increasing and we need people to be aware and take all the necessary precautions to try and protect ourselves."

CLINICAL, MEDICAL, SCIENTIFIC

- The COVID-19 test samples that were found strewn near the busy N2 in the Eastern Cape on Monday could have infected people with COVID-19. The disturbing statement was made by Eastern Cape Department of Heath Superintendent-General Dr Thobile Mbengashe on Tuesday. The health department and the National Health Laboratory Services have launched investigations into the incident. Mbengashe said the incident undermined the government's programme to fight the spread of coronavirus. He slammed the incident. "We want to assure people that it is an incident that will never happen again and should be condemned. It should not have happened."
- Anthony Fauci, director of the US National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, and the most trusted medical figure in that country predicted the <u>US could soon see as many as 100 000</u> <u>new COVID-19 cases per day</u> "if this does not turn around."
- A new study revealed that in <u>countries that adopted the wearing of face masks early in the</u> <u>COVID-19 pandemic saw modest infection rates</u>. The findings of researchers from the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) were published in the American Journal of Respiratory and Critical Care Medicine. According to the authors, the number of infections, as well as the severity of COVID-19 cases, may have been affected by the wearing of face masks as a protective measure in 42 countries across six continents.

ECONOMICS, POLITICS, EDUCATION, ENVIRONMENT, SOCIAL

- <u>Gumtree has seen an increase in scams during lockdown</u> as fraudsters try to trick sellers who are desperate for cash. The platform is especially concerned about "buyer scams", where a scammer fakes a transaction, picks up the item via Uber and disappears with the stolen goods. Pricey electronic goods are usually targeted, and motorcycles are also in hot demand.
- From black tea to bottled water, <u>European companies are taking a hard look at</u> <u>underperforming businesses</u> at a time when investors' profit expectations are already low because of the coronavirus pandemic. The consumer-goods giant Unilever launched a strategic review of the unit in January, as the coronavirus was rampaging through China's Hubei province. At the time, CEO Alan Jope described the business, which includes well-known brands like Lipton and PG Tips, as "a structural drag on Unilever's growth". In a similar vein, Nestlé is considering a sale of its US mass-market bottled water business, which includes the Poland Spring and Pure Life brands. The division globally had its worst performance in a decade last year and the North American unit, in particular, has seen competition from discount brands, as well as consumer resistance to plastic packaging.
